Children to understand what trade is, the trade route and the difference between import and export.

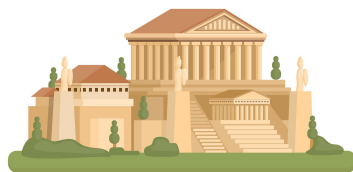
Create a living agora in the classroom with items for children to decide what was imported and exported
