
Year 4, visit to Dorset Museum.



After a tasty lunch, we set off on a short walk to a genuine Roman town house tucked away in the centre of Dorchester. The children were able to enter the house and actually walked across and near 2000 year old mosaic floors. We were able to see how a Roman hypocaust would have worked too.


The children were a credit to Conifers, listening intently, asking very challenging historical questions and showing off their Roman knowledge.

It was delightful seeing all the children dressing up or bringing in book themed objects that they had created at home.


